Sacred Encounter

Dearhearts,

There are those places in our lives that are tipping points, the crest of a hill that marks a new direction ... moments in which change comes to our soul and alters its terrain forever. Alters how we see life, or ourselves ... or God. For Peter, it was the night of bitter weeping – and the subsequent encounter at daybreak with His Redeemer on the Galilean shore that restored to him his dreams and destiny. It had been the night that changed how he saw himself, but it was morning's light that brought him new life. For the Samaritan woman it was an encounter at the well with a perfect stranger who told her everything that she had ever done. Suddenly, life as she had known it was upended. Zacchaeus' sacred encounter came over lunch at his house. The woman bent over for 18 years was changed by a simple touch from a stranger on the Sabbath. Christ often sneaks into our world on cat paws, catching us by surprise in one glorious moment, drenched in the holy, and we are knocked off our stride... sometimes forever.

It happened to me when I was almost thirty. I had never given much effort to prayer. It was a mystery. It still is for that matter, but then it was a mystery without much experience...until God began to draw me toward it. The draw began with the realization that I needed to give God a chance to show me what prayer could mean. It went from there to a hunger for prayer. Intercessory prayer became a dominant wind in my soul. Sometimes there were hours of it...so alien to my former self that had found prayer no more appetizing than dry toast. But something of God's Spirit now stirred my own, and I found that the more I prayed the hungrier I got. "Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you," now made sense to me. But the real tipping point was yet to come. As I entered into intercession for someone now forgotten, I suddenly tripped over into a Holy Place. It was not the room that was filled with Holiness, but my soul. Immersed in a sacred pool that had suddenly opened and swallowed me, my only words were "thank you" or "I love you." Mostly, it was a wordless place of Presence. Saul had been struck blind on the Damascus Road; I was struck mute. When, at last, the Presence faded, I found myself deeply saddened. I feared I would not pass this way again. But the surprise was that this place could be found – and entered – over and over again through prayer. Though intercession remained, the Lord began showing me a new experience, an experience conditioned and accessed by prayer. I came to call it the prayer of communion, of fellowship, truly, with Him.

Though my first experience was sheer Gift, succeeding experiences were summonsed through prayer. In stilling my own voices and entering into a place emptied of my own agenda and open only to the Lord, this prayer chamber was repeatedly filled with His Spirit. Eventually, as spiritual stillness was cultivated, this interior prayer closet could be entered upon closing my eyes. This was a teachable journey... from one glorious moment of surprise to finding our way through the labyrinth of prayer to a hidden sanctuary in the soul where His Spirit and ours converge - and commune.

It is teachable, dearhearts. And it is a tipping point. Life is never the same as we move from sacred encounter to Holy communion in a completely different sacrament than we have tasted before. "Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you." The sacred, and how it confronts you, rests not in your power but in your consent. Give God a chance to catch you by surprise in one glorious moment, and it may change all the rest of the moments you have.
