## "...and He gave gifts to men"

Dearhearts,

In the end, nothing else matters but the gift. That which comes to us from another Hand. For you see, life is gift, and we are entrusted with how to live it.

What we make of our lives is not the question. What we make of the life we've been given is. It is the parable of the talents. Our life is gift. We are to make of it what we can.

I'm reminded of the many great souls I know who pour out their lives to others from broken pots. Who come back to the Well over and over again not for their thirst alone but for water to carry to the desert. Who give not from their wealth, but from their poverty.

There are those friends who have lost sons and daughters, but who still give out to others of their love and compassion. Who have not allowed their hearts to shrink. There are those who live in unrelenting pain, but who still live tenderly with others...those who do not allow the desert to dry their souls. The Rock was struck and water gushed forth in the desert. So it is with them.

My friend Helen died many years ago of breast cancer that metastasized in her neck. In her final months the pain was un-manageable. I asked her how she dealt with it. "I offer it up to Christ as my sacrifice...and let Him take it" she told me, "It's amazing how it helps."

There is the friend who was called to the ministry but his wife decided she was not. Upon divorcing him, his pastoral ministry ended because a divorced man could not be a pastor. He shifted to education and became a principal and pursued his doctorate degree. In his oral presentation for his dissertation, one of the professors disagreed with his thesis and told him to change it. When he found he could not in honesty do so, his doctorate was denied. Yet, I see no bitterness or rancor, only kindness and love in this man.

Helen Keller spoke of the beauty of this world and Anne Frank of its goodness. Sometimes the human spirit is a gallant thing. Emboldened by adversity... enlarged by suffering...made rich in poverty.

*"He led captivity captive and He gave gifts to men."* The lives of these ordinary men and women bear witness to these words. Captivity has, indeed, been led captive in their lives as they laid down any claims they had to another version of their script. Sometimes it is our riches that impoverish our soul. We all live much of our lives out on the rim...caught up in the shell of life, but that which we have scratched and scraped to acquire or secure only fades with time.

We must guard against the shrinkage of the heart that comes with having everything we need. What lingers in my soul is not the glitz that once caught my eye like a glint of mica but that which has come to me from another's Hand.

Eventually, what truly matters catches up with us all. It is best if we catch it before it catches us.

In the end what matters is what we did here with the gift.

"Prevailing Prayer" 7:30 Tuesday Evening May 6

Our spring series on prayer concludes with Brenda's discussion on "Prevailing Prayer." This hour long teaching on the spiritual components of prevailing prayer is adapted from her prayer seminar, "Seeking the Heart of God." Attendance for this series has been strong throughout and encourages us to continue these prayer conversations in the fall.

When Christ entered into the temple and there found moneychangers desecrating it with their wares, His righteous anger burst forth and upended the tables and threw them out as He declared: "Do you not know my Father's house is a house of prayer and you have made it a den of thieves?" In I Corinthians, Paul declares that we – our bodies – now are the temple of God in whom the Holy Spirit dwells. As then, this Father's house is to be known as a house of prayer; and yet the danger for us today is much as it was then. There are far too many things we drag into our temple to pollute it and rob God of His purposes with us.

We are asked to care enough to rid our temple of those things that would corrupt or hinder God's ways with us in prayer. Prayer is a mystery. The Lord's invitation is to enter with Him into this mystery and discover the treasures hidden there.
