Loom of Redemption

Dearhearts,

What is it about fall that draws me? That braces my senses with wonder and makes me feel more alive? That seems to awaken something in me neither spring nor summer has touched? Its winds carry a different feel, not of approaching tempests but of something vivid...an azure dome pulsing overhead as some silent voice calls a continent of geese and ducks and monarchs south.

Spring anticipates what is to come. Bursting forth from winter's vault, it charges into summer's heat and storms, its drought and sun, and then drags itself, spent, into fall. Fall seems to swell in full crescendo of all that has been before, now synthesized in one exultant anthem. It is as though fall has found a rhythm the other seasons have been pressing for. A rhythm that ushers in a fullness of sights and sounds and smells...a palette of glory...a loom that weaves new textures and colors into the fabric of our lives...and we are warmed against the chill...we are awakened to new beauty.

Even the trees have drawn from the soil in which they are rooted, pushing water into the leaves to mix with what the leaves are pulling from the air about them. And then, their heave offering sunward to create summer's green. And as the light wanes and the darkness waxes and temperatures fall, summer's green fades to reveal the glory of fall hidden there all along.

Fall lures me to the possibilities of a way of living that swells in fullness with all that has been. That synthesizes all the dark and light, the heat and cold, the wind and rains and creates an anthem of the soul. Fall signals the culmination of what we have done with what we have known.

Every once in a while you find a person of fall. Someone who swells full with life...who is lovely yet bracing; who carries all the textures of strength and tenderness, the colors of love and grace. Who wears the garment of redemption. They have sorted through their lives. Discarding what is irrelevant, they so fully embrace the moment people want to be with them. Their lives are a palette of vibrant colors...colors of joy and adventure...peace and strength...commitment and faith. And you wonder how they got there? Did they rise from the soil of their birth that way...or did something in their spring and summer bend them thus?

It is these who are rooted in something that is not of them. And they have embraced the winds and rains because of it. They have kept what is worthwhile and dropped what is not. They have not lost sight of their roots.

My dad was a person of fall, I think. Many storms lashed his world...leaving losses that could have left their mark of resentment or bitterness. Yet that was never there. He kept what was worthwhile from those storms, but he dropped what was not. He was rooted in holy soil, and I saw woven into the fabric of who he was new textures and colors, and he was warmed against the frigid winds and awakened to new possibilities. His life was a loom of redemption.

When he went home to glory he was escorted by a burst of glory that had emblazoned his life for many years and muted the sharp corners and rough edges of earlier times.

Fall people reassure us of the possibilities of our own lives...of weathering the storms and emerging...of taking what is there in the soil and air...in the elements beyond our control and producing the vibrant foliage of grace and beauty.

Does Prayer change God's mind? Does it affect overall outcome...or is God going to do what He wants to, anyway?

Christ's entire life was a monument to the power of prayer. Yet, in Gethsemane, His petition for the cup to be removed from Him was not granted. David's prayers for the life of his son went unheeded. Paul's requests that the "thorn" be removed from him were answered only with a promise of grace. Our own prayers are hit and miss. Some "work," some don't.

Yet, history is strewn with golden nuggets of humble prayers answered greatly. The Battle of Dunkirk in World War II was most surely a miraculous deliverance as a result of prayer. Dwight Moody's European ministry was launched on the back of 10 years of devoted prayer by a humble, invalid woman in London. The King James version of the Bible was scripted from the final, prayerful words of a martyr burning at the stake that the King's eyes would be opened to the need for an English translation of the Bible.

Are these just bright and shining moments of prayer at Dunkirk and with Dwight Moody? Or are these available to us on a consistent basis?

What is the nature of prayer.....fundamentally? And what is it all about in the trenches of our lives?

Does He need our prayers?

God does not need our prayers, but He chooses to make us partners with Him. He has always used human instruments for the carrying out of His purposes. He used Moses to bring the children of Israel out of Egypt. He used Joshua to bring them into the Promised Land. He used Phillip to speak to the eunuch. "How shall they believe if they do not hear; and how shall they hear except they preach. And how shall they preach except they be sent?" Romans 10:14-15.

God's purposes are hindered if we do not hold up our end of the deal in this Divine partnership. God gives us the Gift of Partnership with Him. He honors us by inviting us to enter into the ministry and service of prayer.

A Ministry of Connection and Communion With Ourselves, with Others and with God

Dayspring is a ministry that seeks, fundamentally, to put people in touch with themselves, with others and with God in deeper, more meaningful ways. As the Dayspring ministry grows, it seems a good time to provide an overview of how we see this purpose unfolding as the Lord leads.
